PUBLIC EDUCATION

EFVA remains committed to disepelling all the myths around seizures, seizure first aid, and epilepsy in daily interactions. To this end, we spread awareness through TV interviews, webpages, social media, and monthly newsletters. We participate in health fairs in neurology offices with information about epilepsy and the workplace. This year, we've increased our focus on epilepsy and memory. With increased prevalence of misunderstandings with law enforcement, our police training video for epilepsy is available online. Our walks, and especially our Tour de Midnight bike ride, generated a lot of publicity about epilepsy in traditional media around Richmond.



CONSUMER SERVICES

Our walks, races, etc. helped people with epilepsy share their concerns, with over 541 attendees statewide. Spring celebrations had over 214 attendees. Support groups, involving over 62 people accross Virginia, meet regularly. Direct assistance went to 55 families, which included new bicycles and helmets, financial, and medication assistance. The Tour de Midnight, our annual bike ride in the Richmond area had 461 participants. Many clients find our online booklets (on www.epilepsyva.com) useful. We hosted HOBSCOTCH Memory courses. Last but not least, the bulk of our work goes into individual advocacy: keeping people in jobs/school, advocating against the stigma of epilepsy, and personal support. We thank all of our volunteers and coworkers and the epilepsy families who are willing to help us.




PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

We were involved in advocacy about epilepsy to the Virginia Assembly and federal legislatures. EFVA's role in educating daycare centers with the VA Department of Social Services involves learning about epilepsy, administering medications, and safety measures. Dr. Heinan trained Camp Holiday Trails staffers about epilepsy and first-aid. Our services extend to training school personnel and students about epilepsy, for the benefit of client safety and comfort. This year, we have trained 850 police officers. Professional training videos and information were added to our webpage, with over 102,000 views. In addition, we actively train employers of epilepsy heroes and discuss accommodations.

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
