Dr. Lyons was the a Virginian physician who started to work with EFVA on bringing CBD studies to Virginia. Thanks to the studies and the parents, the prospects for bills that make it easier to produce, transport and possess extracts of the marijuana plant look better in the present Virginia General Assembly (SB1027). The Federal Drug Enforcement Agency has continued its policy of non dialogue and unwillingness to reassess the studies, which throw doubt on its Schedule one classification. Schedule 1 means, that is has no currently accepted medical use in the United States, a lack of accepted safety for use under medical supervision, and a high potential for abuse.




BREAKDOWN OF HOSPITAL ADJUSTED EXPENSES PER INPA-TIENT DAY VIRGINIA


